

China Airlines takes full ownership of Tigerair Taiwan

China Airlines will become the full owner of Tigerair Taiwan as Tiger Airways Holdings divests its 10% stake in the carrier.

Roar Aviation III Pte, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Tiger Airways Holdings, has entered into an agreement to sell its 10% stake to China Airlines.

Now, China Airlines owns 90% of Tigerair Taiwan (80% directly and 10% through subsidiary Mandarin Airlines) and Tigerair Airways Holdings owns 10%.

“Notwithstanding the divestment of Tigerair Taiwan, we will maintain an active presence in Taiwan with the combined network of Scoot and Tigerair,” said Lee Lik Hsin, CEO of Budget Aviation Holdings, which owns and manages Tigerair and Scoot.

The deal comes [just weeks after another Taiwanese airline, TransAsia Airways, declared it was ceasing operations.](#)
