

Boeing veteran to retire

Daniel da Silva has announced his retirement after 33 years at the Boeing company.

Da Silva vice-president, strategic regulatory policy over the past eight years at Boeing Capital Corporation.

He started at Douglas aircraft company as sales director - Latin America in 1994. In 1997 he joined Boeing as sales director Brazil and held several sales and marketing as well as customer support roles until 2010.

He then joined the OEM freighter division as vice-president freighter conversion and was vice-president modification and conversion until 2015.

“From the early days at Douglas Aircraft in Long Beach, CA, to the last eight years at Boeing Capital, I’ve done everything from aircraft performance engineering to sales & marketing of airplanes and services, from running a half billion dollar business unit to shaping aircraft finance regulations around the world. It’s been a blast, and I learned so much at every step of my career,” he said.

Between 2015 and 2023 Da Silva was co-chair of not-for-profit organisation Aviation Working Group.

Da Silva said he will now look for a challenge that can use the broad range of experiences he has accumulated in the aviation industry.
