

# Air Chang'an resumes 737-800 deliveries

Hainan Airlines-affiliated Air Chang'an has resumed aircraft deliveries with the addition of two used Boeing 737-800s under lease agreements with CDB Aviation.

The two 2007-vintage 737-800s were previously operated by Air China, which retired them in March and April this year.

The 737-800s were originally leased by GECAS to Air China, *Airfinance Journal's* Fleet Tracker shows.

Standard Chartered Aviation Finance acquired the units from AerCap in 2009 and sold the pair to CDB Aviation in 2018.

Air Chang'an operates a 737-800 fleet, and last added a 737-800 to its fleet in November 2021.

Following the latest deliveries, the carrier has 13 leased 737-800s in its fleet from CDB Aviation, AerCap, Everbright Financial Leasing and Minsheng Financial Leasing.

Air Chang'an launched commercial services in January 1993. It merged with Hainan Airlines in 2000 and was later absorbed into Hainan Airlines.

It resumed service as an independent carrier in May 2016.
